When we were growing up in Italy and Frost, I remember Billy as a fun-loving guy who always had a smile and a big laugh. Billy was a roller skating master! The summer I was 12 or 13, he took me to the rink in Milford almost every night and taught me how to skate. I was never close to being as good as he was, but it was so much fun.

A couple of years later, Billy was working on the pipeline with my daddy in Eden, Texas, near San Angelo. That summer we went swimming at the local pool and drove to San Angelo to jump on the trampolines (a new type of entertainment in the early 60s.)
