



## Chlodine Bittner

September 12, 1924 - January 11, 2020

Chlodine Hulsey Bittner passed away peacefully on Saturday January 11, 2020. She was 95 years old and a resident of The Village at Heritage Oaks in Corsicana, Texas. Born in Murchison, Texas in 1924, she was the daughter of the late George and Mary Ethel Hulsey. After graduating Purdon High School, she attended Business College in San Antonio, Texas and subsequently worked at Randolph Field Air Force Base during WWII. She worked as a telegraph operator for Cotton Belt Railroad before marrying Robert Earl Bittner in 1946. Together, they raised their children and operated the Corbet Grocery Store in Corbet, Texas. Her bookkeeping skills lead to working in the Navarro County Schools Superintendent's Office, the Corsicana ISD, and the Rice ISD from where she retired. Chlodine was a faithful member of First Baptist Church, Corsicana, and a fifty year member of the Eastern Star. She was a devoted and loving daughter, sister, wife, mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, and friend and she is home now with her heavenly Father and many loved ones who have gone before her.

Chlodine is predeceased by her parents, her husband, twin brothers Hulen and Dulen Hulsey, sister-in-law Ruth Elaine Bittner, and many friends.
