



## Christine Watson Marsters

January 31, 1925 - December 13, 2012

Anita Christine Watson Marsters was born January 31, 1925 to Charles Watson and Ava Katherine (Bass) Watson in Stewards Mill in Freestone County.

She was welcomed into heaven by her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, on December 13, 2012, having completed almost 88 years on this earth.

Visitation will be from 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. at Griffin Roughton Funeral Home in Fairfield. Services will be at the First Baptist Church in Fairfield on 11:00 a.m. Saturday, December 15, 2012 with Rev. Ken Pruitt officiating. Interment will follow at the Stewards Mill Cemetery.

At the age of 12, her father passed away. Her mother then moved them to New London, Texas where she graduated from high school then completed her formal education at Baylor University.

On November 24, 1944, Christine married Frank Harrison Marsters, Jr. Three children were born to this union.

Christine lived her faith and was known throughout the community for the special love she had for God. A few years ago, she became a member of First Baptist Church in Fairfield because “God had work for her there.”

She was instrumental in starting the Stewards Mill Annual Christmas

gathering, which is still going on today. For many years, Christine told the Christmas story out of Luke, Chapter 2.
