



Delbert "Red" Hargrave

February 14, 1921 - October 7, 2007

Delbert went home to be with his Lord and Savior Sunday, October 7, 2007. A memorial service will be held on Monday, October 15th at 11:00 A.M. at Northside Baptist Church, 2800 North Beaton in Corsicana, Texas with officiating pastors Dr. Rick Lamb and Dr. Tom Clifton. Delbert was born on February 14, 1921, in Breckenridge, Missouri to Susan B. Amic and Ray Hargrave. Delbert served in the U.S. Navy as a chief petty officer during WWII. He spent most of the war in the South Pacific and was on the USS Detroit in Pearl Harbor the day it was attacked. Later, he was stationed in Gulfport, Mississippi, where he taught refrigeration. Then, in October of 1944 he married his bride of 63 years, Lois Ruth Heaton. They have three children, Monty Hargrave and wife Alenna of Corpus Christi, Texas, Elonda Cassady and husband Gerald of Corsicana, Texas, and Ruth Ann Rogers of Corsicana, Texas. He had nine grandchildren: Anne Marie Growe of Shoreview, Minnesota, Michael Hargrave of Grand Prairie, Texas, Brett Hargrave of Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, Ann Carver of Phoenix, Arizona, Malissa Henrie of Frisco, Texas, Donald Williams of Monterey, California, Heather Williams of Corsicana, Texas, Catherine Bischofhausen of Ft. Worth, Texas and Brittany Hall of Corsicana, Texas. He also leaves behind 16 grandchildren and many nieces and nephews. Delbert was preceded in death by his parents and his brothers Donald Ray Hargrave and Carl Hargrave and sister Joy Phillips. He is survived by brothers James Hargrave of Corsicana, Texas and Monty D. Hargrave of Arlington, Texas and sister Mona Ralph of Pueblo, Colorado.

Delbert's civil service started with deep freeze refrigeration in North Chicago, Illinois, where he was accredited with many patents and designs of home freezers. In 1952, he moved to Minneapolis, Minnesota where he lived for 14 years working for Schaefer Refrigeration and Avenco Vending. In 1966, he moved to Sidney, Ohio and worked for Copeland Refrigeration until retirement. In 1979, he moved to Corsicana, Texas and worked with his brother at James Manufacturing for several years. In 1987, he and Lois became volunteers for the American Baptist Assembly at Green Lake, Wisconsin, where they labored in love for 19 years. Memorials may be sent in honor of Delbert A.
