September 18, 1920 - January 19, 2009

Dorothy Ruth Tucker left this world to be reunited with her husband of 55 years on January 19, 2009. She was 88 years old. She began her journey in Frost, Texas on September 18, 1920 being one of ten children born to John Sims and Willie Eunice York. She married her soulmate, Eugene Tucker, on June 23, 1940. Having spent most of her married life in Corsicana, the Tuckers began worshiping and were charter members of North Beaton Church of Christ. Dorothy became affectionately known as "Granny" by numerous kids and teens while she and her husband ran the Corsicana Skating Rink. After spending some time living in Irving, the couple, made their move back to Corsicana in 1985. Having lost Eugene in 1995, Dorothy spent her remaining years living in their family home being cared for by family. She is survived by daughters and son-in-laws Pamela and Ernie Nelson of Limestone County, Janice Prowell of Alvin, Patricia and Bobby Latham of Kirvin; 10 grandchildren, 18 great grandchildren, 2 great great grandchildren; brother Alton York of Quinlan, sister Wanda June White of Dallas; several nieces and nephews; cousins Helen McCarter of Corsicana; and honorary family members Dene and Lynn Tomlin of Elkhart.
