August 16, 1912 - March 1, 2006

Faye Naomi Snider, 93, of Fort Worth went to be with the Lord Wednesday, March 1, 2006. She died at Baylor All Saints Hospital in Fort Worth. Visitation will be held from 6 to 8 p.m. Friday at from noon to 2 p.m. Saturday at Griffin-Roughton Funeral Home. Services will be 2 p.m. Saturday at Griffin-Roughton Chapel with Pastor B.F. Risinger Jr. officiating. Interment will follow at Oakwood Cemetery. Mrs. Snider was born Aug. 16, 1912, in Elida, N.M. She lived most of her life in Navarro Mills, Purdon, Dawson and Corsicana in Navarro County. She later lived in Lewisville, Burleson and Fort Worth. She was a member of First Baptist Church in Corsicana for many years. She was a school teacher and librarian for 36 years and was a member of Delta Kappa Gamma teachers organization. She was a graduate of both North Texas State University and East Texas State University, having earned two master's degrees. She was a talented musician who throughout her life regularly played piano for church services, funerals and old-fashioned "singings." Into her late 80s, she often played piano for church services in nursing homes. She was preceded in death by her husband, Andy J. "A.J." Snider in June 1986; her parents, John Hiram "Jack" and Barbara Ann Owen Ford; and brother, Stanley. Survivors include her son and daughter-in-law, Dr. Ray D. Snider and Linda of Fort Worth; and grandson, Dillon Snider. She is also survived by her stepson, Ted L. Snider and wife Jane of Little Rock, Ark., and their children Cathy and Ted Jr. The family is thankful for her long and happy life and are confident of their future reunion in heaven.
