“ This post is late, and the service for Gary has taken place. When I read the news in the WF Tx paper, I knew I needed to pass on an experience with Gary that had results beyond my imagination. I had the privilege to meet Gary when I was in my teens. He was humorous and loved to cut up. About 4 or 5 of us, who were like-minded, ran together and stuck to each other like glue. Those were the best times, back then. Our roads went the same direction for years, but over time we became acquaintances and the friendship faded as we took different paths on the same road. In 1996 we crossed paths in Abilene, Tx. He was completing an in-house program that I was just entering. It was a life changing event when I saw Gary in Abilene. You see I was trying to do something different, to find a new way to live but I had no faith that it was possible to change. Then I saw Gary, we greeted each others like survivors from a bad war. He had a light in his eyes and a glow in his spirit. He was happy. He told me that I could do this program because he had stuck it out and completed it. He gave me hope and believed in me. That hope and belief has transcended into over 14 years of sticking on the path of recovery. I've thought about that day hundreds of times since then. In short, I believe that it was no coincidence that Gary was in Abilene when I arrived in 96. I also believe that coincidences are God's way of remaining anonymous. It has always been my hope and prayer that Gary was doing good and I am deeply saddened and disturbed to learn of his death. I just need the family to know that Gary gave me a gift, a gift that lives on today, the gift of hope, hope for a new way of life that lifted me out of the drudgery of addiction, a hope that turned into a life I never dreamed of. Life is good today. God is good today and I thank God for Gary today. He was a huge blessing in my life. I truly miss him. I wish the family the best during this period of grief.
