George Calvin Caperton Sr., 77, of Corsicana passed away on December 31, 2008. George was born to Iva Mae Gaddy-Caperton and Ernest Calvin "Sonny" Caperton in Monticello, Arkansas on February 22, 1931. Life in Monticello for George was much akin to life in Mayberry with memories of local and colorful citizens such as Fuzz and Noel and boys of the Monticello Baptist Home and where life consisted of paper routes, working gas stations and Clay's Grocery, hanging out at the town square after dark, mules, farming, house painting, rubber drives, paper drives, and metal drives for the war effort. There was time for family and friends and good food and enough money for a Hershey Bar and a Coke at the Monticello Drug. And getting around the community by walking and bicycle, and later drives to the great Mississippi River. A good life for a young boy that later became a good and great man, husband, father, grandfather, great grandfather, and friend to so many, many people. If he liked you he liked you and he practically liked everyone. George married his high school sweet heart Doris Evelyn Schooley on December 11, 1950 while in the U.S. Air Force serving as Military Police in Panama City, Florida and Port Orena, California. After returning to Monticello he received his education at Monticello A&M. George and Doris moved their family of three girls at the suggestion of a boyhood friend who had preceded them to Mesquite, Texas and George Calvin (Bud) Caperton Jr. was born in 1961 in Terrell. George became Assistant Tax Collector for Mesquite. In 1965 he was offered and accepted a position as Corsicana School Tax Assessor. In the years that followed he became Chief Appraiser of Navarro County until retirement. George was a longtime member of the Lion's Club, Dad's Club at school's and also a colorful character in his own right at local and various "coffee associations" such places as Douglas's, the old What-a-Burger, various Shell Stations about town, Braum's, and lest we forget Buck Hamilton's north and south of town where they would cook and eat the most unusual things. You were impolite to ask questions. He was preceded in death by his wife of 51 years Doris Evelyn, second son David Foud, and brother Teet Caperton.
