Holly Jean Erdmann Tolbert, 59, resident of Corsicana, Texas passed away Sunday, February 26, 2006 at Navarro Regional Hospital. Visitation will be held Tuesday from 6:00 - 8:00 p.m. at Griffin-Roughton Funeral Home.

Funeral services will be Wednesday March 1, 2006 at 4:00 p.m. with interment to follow at Hamilton-Beeman Cemetery. Holly was born on January 14, 1947 in Aberdeen, South Dakota, to Marvin (Tuffy) and Mildred Erdmann of Groton, South Dakota. She was preceded in death by her husband, Paul Tolbert, father Marvin Erdmann, brother Russell Erdmann, and sister Paula Breitkreutz. Holly's family, including her animals, were of highest importance in her life. Holly bravely fought and defeated lung cancer twice.
