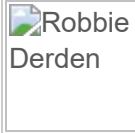


“ I had the privilege of serving with Jeffrey in the United States Navy onboard USS MERRILL (DD-976) in San Diego, CA in 1986-1990. I will never forget when he reported to the ship, we became friends both of us being from Texas. He invited me to go and see a Monster Truck show at Jack Murphy Stadium, it has a new name today. He supplied the tickets and I had a vehicle, I provided the transportation, so I drove us to Jack Murphy Stadium. I still have horrible pictures of that Monster Truck show, since I was terrible with a 35mm manual camera. Over the years we reconnected and kept in touch. Around three years of so ago, he informed me he had made the Temple VA his primary care provider. I told him I live in Temple near the VA. While he was in the Long Term Care (LTC) facility, I would visit him as often as I could usually daily, I would run errands for him and made sure he had the things he needed. Prior to his moving back to Corsicana, I would sit with him and watch different shows in his room until he was ready to fall asleep. We usually watched Wheel of Fortune daily. The last time I was able to chat on the phone with Jeff, I had just arrived at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri Army Base for the Christmas Holidays! RIP Jeffrey, Fair Winds and Following Seas!
