Jessie C. Haynes, 94, of Corsicana passed away Wednesday, Jan. 25, 2006, at Navarro Regional Hospital. Visitation will be held from 6 to 7 p.m. today at Griffin-Roughton Funeral Home. Graveside services will be 2 p.m. Saturday at Hamilton-Beeman Cemetery with Brother Darin Wood. Mr. Haynes was born July 17, 1911, in Easley, S.C., to E.E. Haynes and Rilla Stegell Haynes.
