“ My name is Cynthia (Cindy) Gambrell Self. About 3 years ago she called me on the phone. I can't say enough how wonderful it was to hear her say my name after I said Hello. I knew that voice immediately. You see I had found her youngest Son on Facebook and sent him a message and included how much I'd like to get in touch with his mother, it had been 30 years. About a year later is when Aunt Jettie called.

Man did we love to talk too. Some nights we'd start about 8-10pm and talk till 6 or 7am the next day. GOD I LOVE HER!!!! I can't believe she's gone. We talked, we remembered our past, we talked about our futures. Sometimes we would cry together, sometimes laugh well mostly laugh, GOD I loved her laugh. I'd tell her "You sound so much like your sister my Mom Peggy Joyce Smith Wilson when you talk or laugh". Aunt Jettie would always ask me "You will call me back won't you? I just want us to see each other again" I would have liked to have spent more time with Aunt Jettie. She was fully aware of my situation with my own family and since I take care of my oldest Son who is in a wheelchair she understood. We did however go to Cantons 1st Monday to shop til we dropped. We rented scooters. My daughter Brandy got to meet her. Let me tell you Aunt Jettie could get around very well on a scooter. She'd be out in front of our (3-woman) caravan and a couple of times I thought we might be fixing to get into one of those SMITH'S fight with the public LOL. She of course never knew until much later about the people complaining about her driving and when I told her we both started a laughing.

She made a point to show her Love for me and me towards her. We could talk about anything. We managed some shopping trips and a doctor visit. We'd go eat a few times, and she joined me at a rehearsal in Corsicana, and listened to me sing with bands. I introduced her some folks at a Independent Living Center one time I was singing at and we met for breakfast there in Corsicana. Never once was there a dull or short conversation from either of us. She loved traveling. Branson I believe was one of her favorite places. Aunt Jettie just enjoyed people period! She'd say let me know when DISH NETWORK has the free movies and I did but

she'd be going to her brothers for a marathon of movies on the couch or to the Casinos. I can hear her voice now the way she pronounced Jerry's name "Jer-ree".

She'd talk with me about each and everyone of her children every single time we spoke She loved them all, from the oldest to the youngest. Gil, Debbie, Stevie, Archie and Alec. My sister Donna had the 8 millimeter film moved onto a VHS Tape. Some got damaged in a flood. But for the most part all of our family is on those tapes.

Granddaddy, Nanny, Cochise the horse lol, all of the Smith's that were born at the time and their spouses, and children. Gosh what a wonderful wonderful time we had back then. My Uncles John, Jim, and Jerry playing football or wrestling. The sisters at times had their hair rolled so tight to their heads with Bobby pins they almost look like boys lol. Never a dull moment on the video screen.

Aunt Jettie, I wished you could have met my 2 boys also. Jason my oldest did enjoy the phone conversation with you. I LOVE YOU WITH ALL OF MY HEART, I WILL ALWAYS HOLD OUR TIME AND CONVERSATIONS DEAR TO ME.

HUG my Uncle Flint, my Nanny & Granddaddy, Aunt Linda and her family, Aunt Dorothy, Harold, and Aunt Helen. You are already missed terribly just terribly.
