Granny never met a stranger and treated everyone like they were part of the family. She was everyone’s Granny Farmer. She was one of the strongest and most caring people God put on this earth. We were all so lucky to have her in our lives.

She was also a prankster, one time she put plastic rats in her family members trucks, beds (under the covers), and on neighbor’s gates. She smiled and laughed so hard when someone would accuse her of the act—but would eventually tell on herself. One of her favorite holidays was April Fools—she would call with her latest fib and we would all usually fall for it. She was very convincing. I am not sure anyone ever got her back.

Granny enjoyed Country Music award shows, but let’s be honest it was mostly

to see Dwight Yoakum shake his leg and sing. He was her favorite singer. If you wanted to take her for a treat, you better stop at Taco Bell and grab a nacho supreme and then Braum's for a vanilla milkshake. Her favorite candy was Werther's Original, specifically the hard candy with the caramel in the middle. She always had several bags on hand. Every time I eat a Werther's original candy I will think of her.

Granny always thought of others even when she was admitted into the nursing home. One Christmas she colored pictures, bought frames, and we delivered them to all her friends and family. She didn't receive much money per month, but still wanted to bless others. That was the kind of person she was. She was exceptional.

Throughout her life she was a devoted Christian. She attended church regularly at Hopewell Baptist in Navarro for many decades until it closed and then attended the Cowboy Church of Corsicana before entering Country Meadows in 2016. She would always say how important having a relationship with God is and if you have a problem pray about it. I am certain that when she arrived at the gates of Heaven her name was written in the book of life in CAPS and bold font. She will be missed dearly, but it brings us peace to know that we will see her again one day.

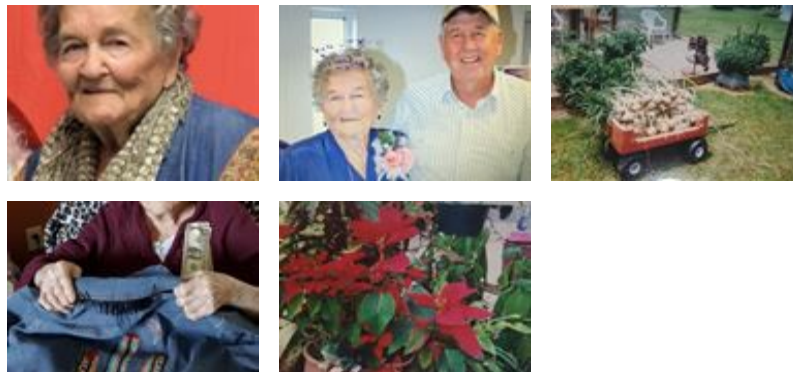
