John E. Cummings, resident of Bushland, Texas and formerly of Fort Worth, passed away on Saturday morning, April 19, 2014 of pancreatic cancer at the age of 61. John was born March 25, 1953 in Graham to Gloria Womack and John Elwyane Parsley. His grandparents Noble and Velma Womack adopted John when he was 2 months old and forever in his heart they were his momma and daddy. At age 5 he was adopted by Perry Cummings.

John graduated from Sam Houston High School in 1972 and had the pleasure of serving his country in the U.S. Navy from 1972 thru 1976 and the Air National Guard.

John has left behind his wife of 38 years Toni Soape Cummings and their children Krista Cummings of Bushland, John E. Cummings, Jr. and wife Deborah of Joshua, Terry Fitch of Arlington. Grandchildren Drew E. Fitch, Emily Jo Fitch, John Ethan Cummings III and Gracie Cummings.

Survivors also include his brother Charles Womack and wife Linda of Savannah Georgia, sister in law Donna Jo and husband Scott Lappe, brother in law Donnie Soape and wife Gail. Numerous nieces, nephews, family and friends also mourn his loss.
