We lived over an hour away and as we purchased additional tracts of land over the next few years, Ken was helpful and generous to our family by offering to front our survey fees as a favor. He was always reimbursed on our next trip to Frost. Before it was listed for sale, Ken showed us what is our current home in Frost. His friendship and trust in our family was ALWAYS appreciated and NEVER taken for granted. We moved to Frost in 2003. Mayor Reed along with his wife Joan, showed such faith, enthusiasm, and backing, both financially and by way of their volunteerism for ideas and efforts put forth to benefit families in Frost many times over and in multiple ways. Some examples of these include what became annual events as "The Frost Christmas Parade and Christmas in the Park", "City of Frost Easter Egg Hunt", and the manpower provisions for the decorating of the City at Christmas, Memorial Day, July 4th, and Labor Day. As Mayor in 2005 and 2006, Ken strongly supported and contributed to the efforts to obtain new playground equipment for Frost City Park to benefit generations of families to come. He personally oversaw the restoration of the see-saws, installation of the baby swings, "spring" car, flag pole, water fountain, and park benches. All were new additions to the City Park. Both Ken and Joan had the hearts of servants to the many people in the surrounding areas of Frost, Tx. My husband and I, our daughters, and MANY others are all the BETTER for having met and lived along side of the Reed's, and the City of Frost is better too! We wish his family members well during this time of grief. We will miss our friend in body and HONOR, CHERISH, and CELEBRATE his memory in spirit.

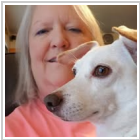
