Lila Rutherford Lila Rutherford, 98, of Corsicana passed away Sunday, Nov. 5, 2006, at Twilight Home. Graveside services will be 3 p.m. today at Grange Hall Cemetery with Pastor Mark Luera officiating. Lila Rutherford was born Aug. 31, 1908, in Barry to William Benjamin Rutherford and Mary Ardenia Butler Rutherford. She graduated from Barry High School in 1924. She earned a bachelor's degree from North Texas State Teachers College in Denton in 1935 and a degree from the Baylor University School of Nursing in Dallas, also in 1935. In 1945 she earned a master's degree from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Mich. After working as a public health nurse for various government agencies from Detroit, Mich., to Austin, Texas, Miss Rutherford returned to Navarro County in 1946. She began a long career here as a public health nurse for all the schools in Navarro County, employed by the Navarro County Health Department. After a few years, the Corsicana Independent School District hired her to be the school nurse for Corsicana only. Miss Rutherford retired from that position in 1973. Survivors include her nieces and nephew, Frances Seales and Geneva Drane, both of Alabama, and Charles Rutherford of Dallas.
