



Lynda Tanner

March 10, 1940 - April 7, 2024

On Sunday, April 7th, 2024, Lynda Jean Adams Tanner peacefully passed away at the age of 84, surrounded by her loving family in Ennis, Texas. She was the fifth of six siblings, born to Virgil "Bill" and Thelma Prater Adams in Dawson, Texas on March 10th, 1940.

In 1988, she lost her soulmate of 31 years, Cloys Don Tanner. She was also preceded in death by her two brothers, Don Allen Adams and his wife Mary Beth of Tatum, New Mexico and Dan Irvin Adams of Duncanville, as well as her sister JoAnn Farmer and her husband Jackie of Corsicana.

Lynda is survived by her two sisters: Karinell Tucker of Waco, Joyce Lynn Campbell and her husband John of Thornton, Texas. Her son, Michael Don Tanner, and his wife Ann of Corsicana. Born and raised in Dawson, Texas, Lynda grew up in the black-land mud, as she often described it. She worked alongside her siblings, picking cotton from an early age. Her father would teasingly say that she picked more stalks than actual cotton. At the tender age of 17, she married her one and only love, Cloys Don, on May 31st, 1957. Interestingly, this date became a cherished family tradition, as her in-laws and her son and daughter-in-law were all married on the same day.

Despite a brief stint in Lubbock, Texas, Lynda continued her education and graduated in 1958 from Dawson High School. She took a job at Haggar

Slacks in Corsicana, where she worked for many years until her daughter was born. Later, she used her remarkable talent to create samples for Neiman Marcus and other stores, even designing bridesmaid dresses for her daughter's wedding.

Lynda was born and raised in a loving family and she continued to share her love and compassion for others throughout her life. From caring for her grandmother as a young child to nurturing her own children, she was always there when anyone needed help. Her unwavering reliability made her a pillar of support for those around her.

Lynda held a special place in her big heart, for her grandson Colton. To her, he was the embodiment of innocence and the apple of her eye. Their shared laughter and whispered secrets, wove a bond that transcended generations. Lynda cherished moments spent with her sisters, companions in mischief and confidantes in life. She especially enjoyed the lively card games and vacationing together. Their laughter echoed through the years. She embraced adventure with open arms. Riding motorcycles, exploring rugged trails on four-wheelers and camping under star-studded skies—the thrill of discovery fueled her spirit. Those family vacations, were her canvas, painted with joy, love and shared experiences.

Lynda's light radiated wherever she stepped. Her infectious smile could melt even the coldest hearts. She was the first to crack a joke, to lighten the room's atmosphere and to speak her mind, with unapologetic honesty.
