Madelyn Glasgow, 85, of Austin, formerly of Corsicana, died tragically in a head-on collision near Spicewood on New Year's Day, 2016.

She was born and raised in Trenton, New Jersey, but moved to Corsicana, Texas when she married James L. Glasgow in 1949. They were the owners of James Glasgow Exxon station until his death in 1964. She was widowed at 34 and raised three young daughters. She was very active at Immaculate Conception Catholic Church and James L. Collins Catholic School where her girls attended school. She worked for many years as the executive director of Camp Fire Girls in Corsicana, including running Camp Wanica each summer. In 1988 she moved to Austin and has lived with her daughter and son-in-law, Mary Ann and Dale Baker, ever since. She worked at Sears in Austin and was a hard-working, loyal employee until her retirement in 2013 at age 83. She always treasured her years at Sears and the wonderful friends she met there. She continued to meet some of her co-workers for lunch once a month until her death. She loved dancing and her wonderful group of friends at the South Austin Senior Citizen's Center, playing cards and dominoes, but mostly being with her family. She was fortunate to have all of her children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren in the Austin area.
