Maudie Faye Jordan, resident of Corsicana, passed away on Wednesday, February 20, 2008 at the age of 94 in Corsicana. She was born near Dawson in the Union High Community on January 24, 1914 to I.H. "Bud" Jordan and Eunice Pearl Sawyer Jordan. Maudie graduated from the Union High Schools where she excelled in sports, especially basketball as the high scorer for the team. Her family was very important to her. She took care of her younger siblings after the death of her mother and was later a caregiver for her special needs sister Myrtle. She worked for the Mexia State School in the evening for 15 years retiring in 1972. Maudie was involved in the Ladies Auxiliary at the Pursley Missionary Baptist Church and later with her church in Corsicana at the Second Avenue Baptist Church. She liked to crochet and watch the Texas Rangers and Dallas Cowboys. In her lifetime Maudie only lived in two homes, the one she grew up in and the one in Corsicana where she moved to be closer to town. Maudie was preceded in death by her parents: I.H.
