Randall Ray Moore (“Randy”) passed away May 12, 2013 at the age of sixty. He was born to Billy Ray and Lois Crawford Moore on February 15, 1953, in Frost, Texas. Randy was a graduate of Frost High School, Austin College (Sherman, Texas) and Texas Tech Law School.

In his professional life, Randy clerked for the Seventh Court of Appeals of Texas in Amarillo, was an associate at Windle Turley Law Firm in Dallas and co-founded the Hyatt, Crabtree and Moore Law Firm in Dallas. During his career, he served on the Board of Directors for the State Bar of Texas and was active in the Texas Board of Legal Specialization. Randy participated in Texas High School Mock Trial and had the honor of being a keynote speaker for the Texas High School Mock Trial Annual Competition.

Randy’s two children were his greatest pride and joy, and he loved every minute spent with them, whether it was playing cards, putting together puzzles or watching them participate in extracurricular activities.
