Following a brief illness, Ray Dean Ingham, 83, passed away on Monday, July 5, 2021 at Navarro Regional Hospital in Corsicana, Texas.

Dean also enjoyed his daily trip to town for a morning chat (he called it breaking news) and a cup of coffee with his local buddies.
