Ray Elmer Whitener was born in Blooming Grove Texas on January 15, 1946, and he drag raced off into the sunset on September 16, 2024, in Corsicana, Texas. This was the second time he died. The first time, he managed to slip back in. His spirit was released from his worn-out shell of a body and now he is drag racing in Heaven. He has reconnected with his mother, Ruth Moore, father, Ralph E. Whitener, his other dad Sidney Moore, his sister, Linda Ruth Mershawn, and his brother, Don Whitener, and many other long-gone family and friends.

He left behind his wife, Nita (Hot Stuff as he called her) of 56 years, children Amanda Carver and husband, Zack, Chris Whitener and wife, Jerri, grandsons, Mikey and Matthew Carver, nephew/son, Jon Mershawn, nieces Haley Whitener and Hillary Hutto, and great grandkids. He also left behind

many adored friends and family. Ray served in the US Army in the Vietnam War. He began his career in the 70's with Lone Star Gas (Atmos Energy) and retired in 2016. He loved fast cars, westerns, reading on his Kindle, dishing out jobs to his kids and grandkids and paying them for their services, giving to others, tinkering with everything, old music, whispering smart ass comments under his breath, and his biggest regret, his 1969 AMX.

A celebration of life will be announced later. Cremation will take place, and his ashes will be spread by his family after they get tired of having him around. Everyone who remembers Ray knows what a kindred spirit he is. He will be missed by all who knew him.
