March 25, 1925 - December 26, 2015

Richard Allen Dill, 90, of Streetman, Texas passed away peacefully on Saturday, December 26, 2015 at home. He was born in Bellevue, Pennsylvania on March 25, 1925. He resided on Klondike Road in Johnsonburg most of his life, before moving to Streetman in 1999 to be closer to his family. He served his country in World War II with the US Navy in the Pacific on the USS Converse, Destroyer Battle Group 23, where he received the Presidential Unit Citation for heroism and a Purple Heart. Upon returning from the war, he was married to the former Margaret Padasak, on April 27, 1946 at Holy Cross Church in Rasselas. Margaret preceded him in death in 2014. While Dick was an only child, he always considered his eight brothers in law and two sisters in law as his siblings.

Dick retired after 43 years at the former Penntech Papers, Inc, Johnsonburg, Pennsylvania and was a member of St. John Lutheran Church. He was an accomplished craftsman, having built his home in Klondike as well as several others in the area. He was always available to anyone in town needing help with home repairs. He was an avid hunter and fisherman and was still catching fish after his ninetieth birthday. He also loved gardening, meticulous about his yard and well known for his "gum drop" shaped trees.

He is survived by his daughter Marlene and her husband Tom Russell of Streetman, Texas, grandson Jeff Russell and wife Christine and their children Catherine and Brady of Williamston MI, granddaughter Jill Raber and husband Ryan and children Grace and Thomas of Plano Texas, granddaughter Erin

Overholt and husband Geoff and children Devin and Mason of Little Elm, Texas. In addition to his wife, Dick was preceded in death by his parents Gerald and Rose (Launer) Dill. Funeral services will be held on February 20, 2016 at St. John Lutheran Church in Johnsonburg at a time to be determined.
