



Sandra Fondren Windsor

January 12, 1944 - December 7, 2018

Sandra Louise Fondren Windsor, 74, passed away in Farmersville, Texas on December 7, 2018. Sandra was born on January 12, 1944 in Corsicana, Texas to Willard Jay and Dortha Mae Brown Fondren. Her birthdate of January 12 was shared with her younger brother, David, and their great grandmother, Georgia Stokes Carroll.

Sandra was a 1961 graduate of Corsicana High School and a Collins Scholarship recipient. Sandra married Robert Windsor on December 12, 1964. She received her bachelors degree from North Texas University as did her mother and brother. Sandra obtained her masters degree from Texas Women's University. She was a life-long educator with Dallas ISD starting as a special education teacher and finishing as an assistant elementary principal.

The latter part of her life, Sandra was a care-giver. She took care of her husband, Robert Windsor, as he battled Huntington's chorea. She took care of her aunt, Josephine Brown. She was the caregiver for her Mother. She rescued and cared for dogs and cats. Her last dog was named Lucky. Any animal rescued by Sandra was indeed "lucky."

Sandra was preceded in death by her parents, her sister Jorene and her husband Robert Windsor. She is survived by her husband's children: Paulette, Elaine, and Robert and his grandchildren. She is also survived by her brother,

David Fondren, and wife, Bobbie, nephew and nieces: Jay Fondren and wife Anne, Katie Louise Snider and husband Clay, and Jobeth Fondren. She is survived by 6 great nephews and two great nieces: Micah, William, Benjamin, Elijah, and Davis Fondren, Caleb Snider, Lilly Snider, and Mae Louise Fondren and a number of cousins.

Graveside services are pending. Sandra will be interred at DFW national cemetery with her husband at a later date. Family visitation will be December 29th from 3:00 - 5:00pm at Griffin - Roughton Funeral Home.

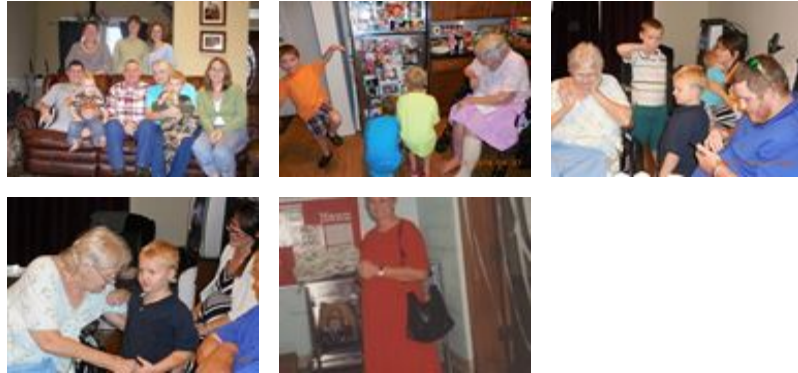
