He graduated from Lancaster High School and attended Texas A&M University in College Station, Texas graduating with a degree in Mechanized Agriculture. Terry married the girl of his dreams, Cathy Thomas, in 1979. Their home was blessed with 3 exceptional children and over 27 years of happy memories. Terry entered the United States Air Force in 1987. He attended Officer Training School and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant beginning a long, honorable career that called him to challenging, interesting assignments including the United States, Europe, and the Middle East. Terry served primarily as an Aircraft Maintenance and Logistics Officer and was instrumental in the deployment of critical national strategic airborne assets to various conflicts around the world ranging from Desert Storm through Enduring Freedom. He developed expertise in International Training and represented the United States in the Office of Defense Cooperation, Ankara, Turkey. He was recognized with numerous awards and citations for his dedicated and meritorious service.
