



## Thomas Albert Neyfeldt

June 6, 1940 - December 7, 2017

Thomas Albert Neyfeldt, 77, of Streetman, Texas died December 7, 2017th after a long struggle with COPD at Navarro Hospital, Corsicana, Texas. Tom was born in Berwyn, Illinois, a suburb of Chicago, on June 6th, 1940. He was preceded in death by his parents Chester and Joelenta Neyfeldt and brother Jerry Neyfeldt, all of Chicago, Illinois. Tom is survived by his wife, Lelia Allmon Neyfeldt, of 56 years, his son, Christopher Thomas Neyfeldt and Amy Hane of Topeka, Kansas, his twin grandsons Alexander Neyfeldt of Houston, Texas and Christopher Jr. Neyfeldt of Rosenberg, Texas, granddaughter, Sarah Jean Neyfeldt of Rosenberg, Texas, and niece Melissa Neyfeldt of Chicago, Illinois. Tom attended Immaculate Heart of Mary in Chicago, kindergarten through

grammar school and graduated from St. Patrick's High School's very first graduating class in 1958. He studied Electrical and Automotive Engineering at the Illinois Institute of Technology, and began his career as an Engineer at Sun Electric in Chicago where he met his wife. They married in 1962 at Immaculate Heart of Mary. Their son, Chris, was born in 1963. They remained living in Chicago and then Arlington Hts. (suburb) for fifteen years, then moved to Boiling Springs, Pennsylvania, (near Harrisburg) where Tom worked for Roger Penske, traveling abroad on various engineering projects, as well as all over North America. While still in Illinois Tom had bought his first sail boat and learned to sail on Lake Michigan, he graduated to a bigger sailboat and moved it with the family to Pennsylvania – the boat was moored at Middle River, Md. and most weekends were spent sailing Chesapeake Bay. The family home was situated on South Mountain just above the Cumberland Valley, a short distance to D.C., Virginia, Maryland, Gettysburg, NYC, Boston – depending on which direction they headed. In 1993, the family moved to Texas, back to where his wife was born and raised, Corsicana, and settled in Streetman, Texas. He loved being in Texas, he loved the space and all the animals, and had lots of mentors who helped him to learn “the ropes.” Tom continued working and traveling until he retired at the age of 65. COPD made its appearance about 5 years later. He had given up smoking thirty-five years before December 7, 2017. It was his longest journey.
