Troy Allison, formerly of Corsicana, passed away in The Woodlands on Friday afternoon, August 15, 2014 with his family at his side at the age of 90. Troy Dale Allison was born in Blooming Grove on March 8, 1924 to Harry E. Allison & Molly Lillian Berry Allison. He went home to be with Jesus August 15, 2014 at age 90. Troy attended the Corsicana State Home until he entered the Army at age 17. He served in the 90th Division Infantry and fought in three major battles of WW II: The Normandy Invasion, Battle of the Bulge. They were called the "Tough Hombres" Texas & Oklahoma. He also returned to serve in the Korean War. He is a recipient of the Bronze Star for Bravery.

Troy is the loving father of Tommy, Troy James & Barbara & her husband Ron; the granddad of Jessica & husband Ricky, Bethany, Micah and Tillie; his great grand children are Machala, Ricky & Laela.

Troy worked for the Railroad and then became a business owner in Houston for many years. He then moved to Corsicana where he has many friends. Later in life, Troy moved back to Spring, TX where he lived out his years with his daughter and family. Troy had a strong faith in Jesus as his savior and was ready to leave this earth. He will be missed so much, but we know we will see him again!
