



## Warren Huffer

December 10, 1919 - June 4, 2008

Warren R. "Ray" Huffer, 88, beloved by all who knew him, peacefully passed away at Legacy Hospice in Tyler on June 4, 2008 with his wife and family at his side. Ray was born in Addington Oklahoma on December 10, 1919 to Ida and Marvin Huffer. After high school Ray worked in Addington until the bombing of Pearl Harbor after which he and his brother, Elmer "Huff" Huffer, joined the army. Although trained as a telegraph operator, Ray became a scout for the infantry upon his arrival overseas. He saw extended action in the Aleutian Islands and the Philippines winning a bronze star and other commendations. After serving 4 years in the Army during WWII, Ray was hired by Exxon for whom he worked for 35 years retiring in 1982. He and his wife Wanda settled in Dawson where they lived for 12 years before moving to Corsicana. He and his wife were members of the First Methodist Church of Corsicana for many years. Ray enjoyed traveling and he and his wife visited several countries as well as Alaska and Hawaii. Self educated man and a voracious reader, he once read the entire encyclopedia in his quest for knowledge. He is preceded in death by his parents and brother Elmer. He is survived by his wife of 61 years Wanda Hawkins Huffer, one daughter Patricia Prince and husband Wayne Prince of Tyler, several nieces, grand nieces and nephews.
