Mr. William K. Brietz former President of Whiteselle Brick and Lumber Company, passed away on Friday, January 23, 2009. Mr. Brietz was born to Marian Cheney Brietz and Sydney K. Brietz on October 20, 1925. He graduated from Corsicana High School in 1943. He served in the Navy from May 24, 1943 until May 14, 1946. He served 12 months of sea duty aboard the USS LCI (1) 701. He married Cora Nell Stanley April 10, 1948. During his business career he was a member of the Corsican Rotary Club, served on the Advisory Board of the Salvation Army. He served on CISD school board from 1968-1972. He was a long time member and supporter of the Corsicana Y.M.C.A. joining in 1937 and remaining a member until his health failed. He was a member of the Corsicana Country Club where he enjoyed many hours of golf with his golf buddies. He joined the First Baptist Church at an early age. He was a Deacon, taught Sunday School and served various committees for 75 years. He is survived by wife Cora Nell of 60 years of Corsicana, son Stanley Kyle Brietz, daughter Kimberly Palmer, grandson Dillon Palmer of Allen, Texas. Service is scheduled for Monday, January 26, 2009 at the First Baptist Church with B. F. Risinger and Dr. David Edwards. Burial will follow in the Oakwood Cemetery.
