Willie Rex French Willie Rex French, 94, went to be with his Lord on March 25, 2005. He was born at Navarro Mills on Dec. 10, 1910, and lived there with his wife of 68 years, Christine Thummel French, where they were members of Navarro Mills Baptist Church. He attended his first worship service in a baby buggy shortly after the wood frame church was built in 1910. He was preceded in death by parents, Willie and Minnie Lee French; son, Neilan French; and grandson, Willie Neilan French. He is survived by his wife, Christine French of Navarro Mills; daughter-in-law, Ellene French of Corsicana; son, Charles and his wife Sandra of Mesquite; daughter, Carolyn and her husband Joe Sawyer of Mesquite; 10 grandchildren, 12 great-grandchildren; a niece, Naomi Lidderdale; and nephew, Aldon Crecelius. As a young adult he was a member of a string band where he played the violin. He continued to play at community functions for many years. He owned and operated a grocery store at Navarro Mills. When he closed that store, he went to work in Corsicana for Wooley and Payne Grocery and then retired from Slates Grocery.
